



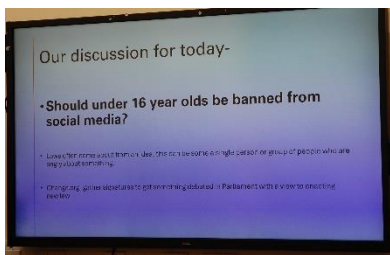
**SPSP Community Day**
